Preparing for the Australian Para-cycling Track Championships by James Victor

With just under a month remaining to the Australian Para-cycling Track Championships in Adelaide (5 to 7 February), State team selections should have been finalised, and training programs fine-tuned to be in your peak 'Track' form.

Check List

The important things to remember and check-over before travelling should cover:

- Equipment Road and Track bikes
- Competition and Training wheels
- Competition and Training Clothing, including TT helmet
- Wind Trainer or Ergo
- Check with your State Team coach/manager regarding borrowing of State team equipment, helmets, etc. before you leave home
- Training/Taper plan and Race Day schedule. Always best to have a printed copy with you
- Race Licence to be given to your State team Manager prior to, and during competition

Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) Paperwork - IMPORTANT!!!

ATUEs have been abolished and a full TUE must be completed. This form can be obtained from the ASADA website (www.asada.gov.au), it is to be completed and submitted to Sonya Simpson (Sonya.Simpson@ausport.gov.au) as soon as possible.

For any banned medications, asthma medications or supplements that need to be declared for any ASADA testing, in-and-out of competition, your TUE needs to be up-to-date and submitted to Sonya, prior to arriving in Adelaide for Track Nationals.

Even if your current TUE has an expiry date of March to June 2009, you should resubmit a TUE to bring you in-line with your Renewed 2009 Racing License.

Race Shoes

One tip that has been recommended to our representative teams over time, and beneficial to travelling riders/teams, is to carry your Race shoes with you as hand-luggage on your flight. You would normally be able to borrow a bike, pedals, clothing, etc. for a day or two, if they go missing in transit, and without too much discomfort to adjust too borrowed items; BUT your Race Shoes are irreplaceable so close to a major benchmark event in your competition planning.

New Riders, Classifications

For those that are new to Cycling, and have not received a Domestic and/or International Para-cycling Classification, the plan is to have Cycling Australia's Para-cycling Classifier, Anouska Edwards, completing Classifications on Wednesday February 4 at the Adelaide Super-drome (Classifying Room to be advised).

Training and Competition Plan

If anyone needs some advice, or your not quite sure of how your final preparations maybe unfolding in the next few weeks, feel free to email James Victor (James.Victor@cycling.org.au) with a brief email and training and performance related questions. Ideally these queries should come from your Coach to James, who will then be open to provide some brief tips and information to help out with your final week's preparations.

NHS Round 2 proves no holiday on the Sunshine Coast

The second round of the National Handcycling Series (NHS) was successfully held on the Sunshine Coast. Many thanks to the proactive "Sunshine Coast Cycling Club" for their hosting of the round. Elite handcyclists & Teams descended into Queensland on the Friday, with many riders eager for another weekend of fantastic racing.

The 20km ITT was held in the beautiful area of Lake Weyba. The course looked like it was going to produce some fast times, however a long steady climb and the temperature of the day challenged the Handcyclists to their limits. Athletes stated "the course was Excellent but very deceiving"

Stuart Tripp again took out the Division C honours, with George Kambouris & David McNaught taking the minor places.

In Division B, Craig Barrett was again too strong, leading Michael Taylor and Jarred Moncur over the line.

Rowan Bowles was first in Division A, with Fred Nitz coming in second.

Sunday's hilly 40km Road Race was held at the Glass House Mountains in 30 degree heat. The riders were set the challenge from the start with two short but sharp climbs combining with some rolling hills, meaning that some were no doubt going to be left behind.

Despite a few mechanicals on the rough surface, all riders competed hard, setting great pace to ensure fast times were recorded.

Again, the top riders from the previous day's time trial in each Division proved they were also the leaders in the road race with the same placings coming to fruition.

Premier's Award for Paris

Paralympic cyclist Jayme Paris has been presented with the prestigious NSW Premier's Award in recognition of her outstanding athletic achievements and advocacy work.

Competing at her first Paralympic Games, Jayme won a bronze medal in the 500m time trial in the LC3-4/CP3 class in Beijing and narrowly missed a second bronze in the Individual Pursuit despite smashing her personal best time by more than 30 seconds.

It continued a whirlwind rise for the 19-year-old after she was discovered in the Toyota Paralympic Talent Search Program conducted by the Australian Paralympic Committee.

Away from the track, Jayme also works tirelessly to educate people about living with a disability as a Telstra Paralympic Education Program Speaker and as a NSW Premier's Sporting Challenge Ambassador.

"When the Premier asked me to name someone who made an outstanding difference to the community of Blacktown, Jayme came straight to my mind," Paul Gibson, NSW Member for Blacktown, said.

"When you meet Jayme and her wonderfully supportive parents Stephen and Tracey, you sense their combined passion for youth in sport, disabled youth in sport and most of all their desire to tell people that anything is possible, no matter what your circumstances."
